

Re-envisioning a Peaceful Northeast India: Peace Education Training Program for Northeast Students and Youth

Northeast India, connecting the Indian border with Tibet, Myanmar, Bangladesh and Bhutan, gained some special interest by the government, as the Prime Minister came up with a new acronym for this region: NEZ – Natural Economic Zone, with the aim to start some development project in this region of India. Despite the progress that has been made so far, violence and insurgency are still common in Northeast India.
